Despite the City's efforts to create transparency, the labyrinth of its agencies and regulations affecting construction and the physical integrity of existing buildings remains a mystery to most property owners, contractors and their counsel. Topics include the requirements and enforcement of "Local Law 11," skilled-trade licensing, the "Loft Law," the progression of violations through various administrative channels, and when violations lead to criminal prosecution and other long-term consequences.
